This season, we celebrate Ellen's centennial year – she would have been 100 on November 7, 2019.

Ellen made her artists feel as if they could conquer the world. She encouraged them to challenge themselves, not just as artists, but as human beings who could transcend limitations. I experienced this as a member of Great Jones Repertory Company performing *The Trojan Women* all over the world.

In each place, we experienced the power of the work and the impact it had on the audience. I portrayed Andromache who fell to her death by jumping off the balcony into the arms of my fellow actors, about 15 feet below. Standing at the edge of the balcony, I was terrified. Yet, Ellen always made you feel that you could do anything, and she told me to jump. So I did. I jumped off that balcony for many performances and it never got any easier, but I will never forget the feeling of that moment just before the leap. That experience informed how I work today. Ellen taught me to jump. In turn, I ask La MaMa artists to jump, and we make that leap together.

As Ellen used to say, "the is is the was and the was is the is." That theory of connection throughout time is the cord that binds us together. We hope you will join us throughout the season to celebrate her profound vision and enduring legacy.

Founder and director of the renowned Ecole des Sables in Senegal, Acogny, who is now in her 70s, has shaped a new generation of dancers and choreographers in Africa.

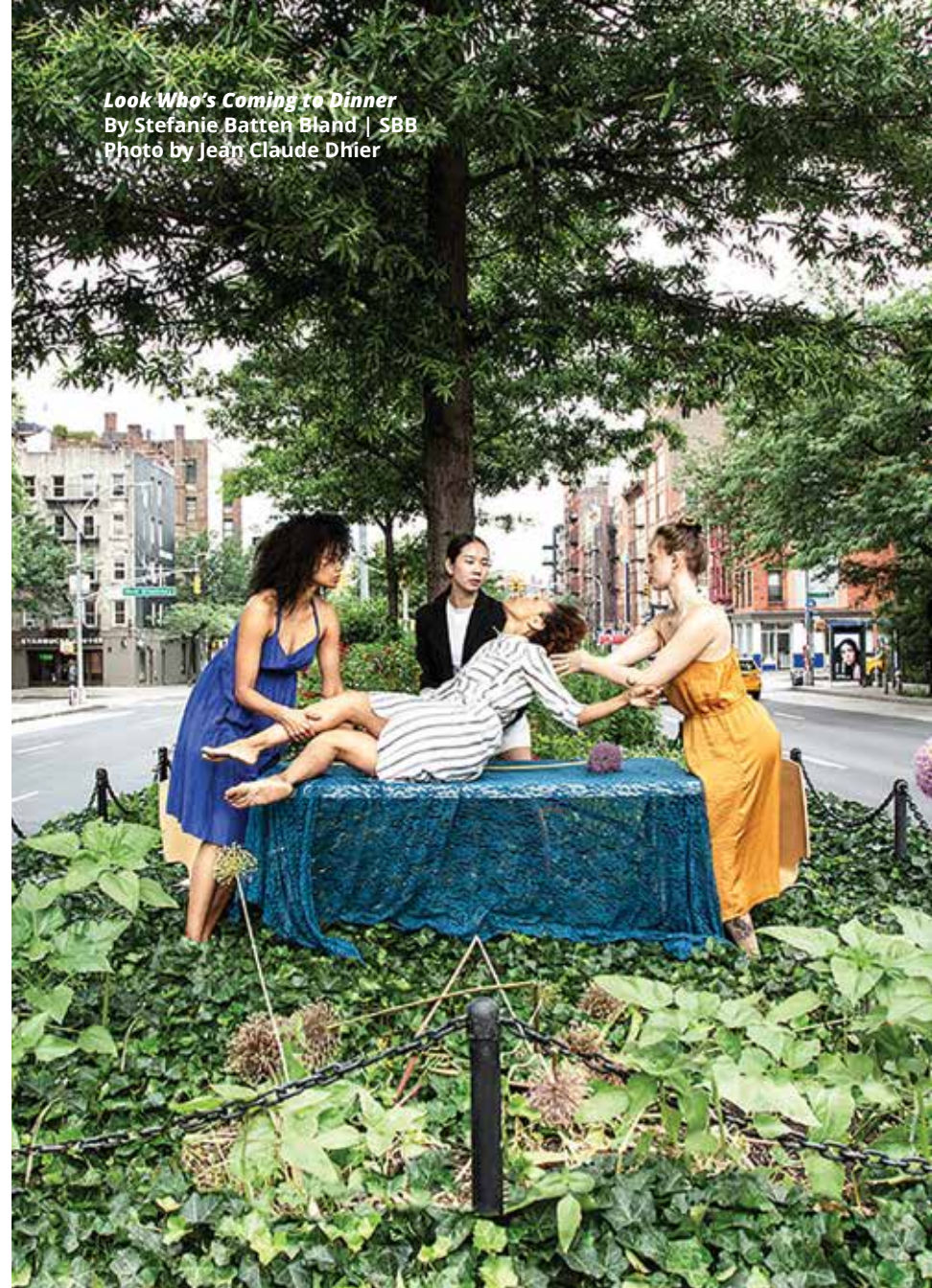
EVERYDAY MURDER

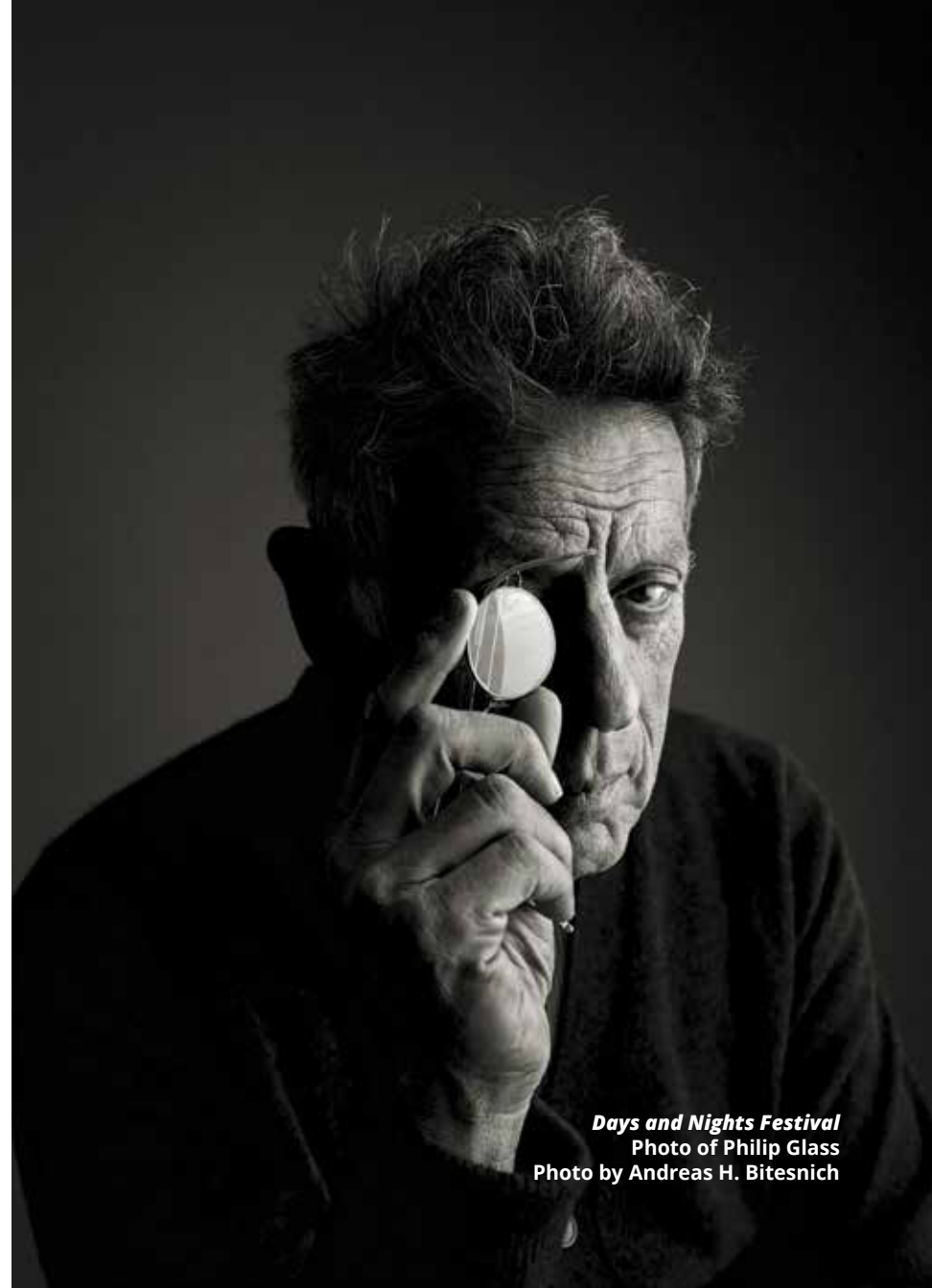

First presented at La MaMa in 1980, this piece chronicles the victimization of a psychiatric inmate by the outside world, written in response to the reformatory Italian Mental Health Act of 1978.

Teatro Patologico was founded by Dario D'Ambrosi, one of Italy's most distinguished theatre artists, who has made a career of productions that portray the unique perspective on life of people with psychiatric disabilities.

Hoppla's societal cross-section of political conspiracies, failed revolutions, feminist emancipation, and class solidarity suggests that it is only in the constant struggle against power that we are alive.

In conjunction with the New School Centennial, Eugene Lang College celebrates Erwin Piscator's Dramatic Workshop and the arrival of epic-documentary techniques in America.

The Festival closes with a special concert, featuring Glass on piano and Tim Fain on violin.

An underground, kinetic ride through the Cowboy myth, performed from a queer perspective, this dance-theatre work fuses personal storytelling and movement to re-create scenes from western movies. The performance examines same-sex intimacy, self-awareness, and fear of being marginalized in a fictional West.

Since 2010, the Pioneers Go East Collective has developed 11 original works. Through performance, video, and curated series, the Collective creates platforms of inclusion to celebrate LGBTQ and feminist artists.

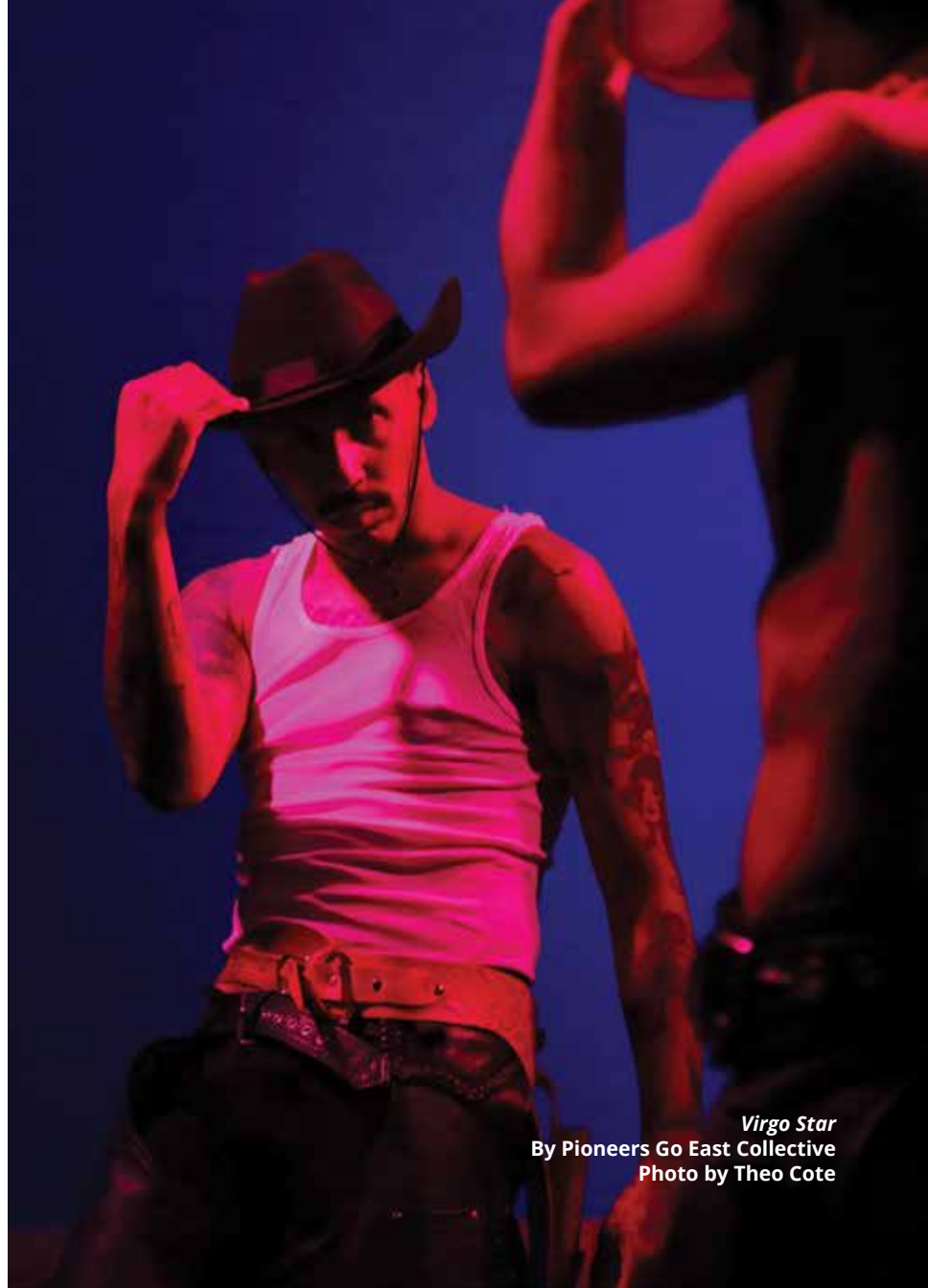



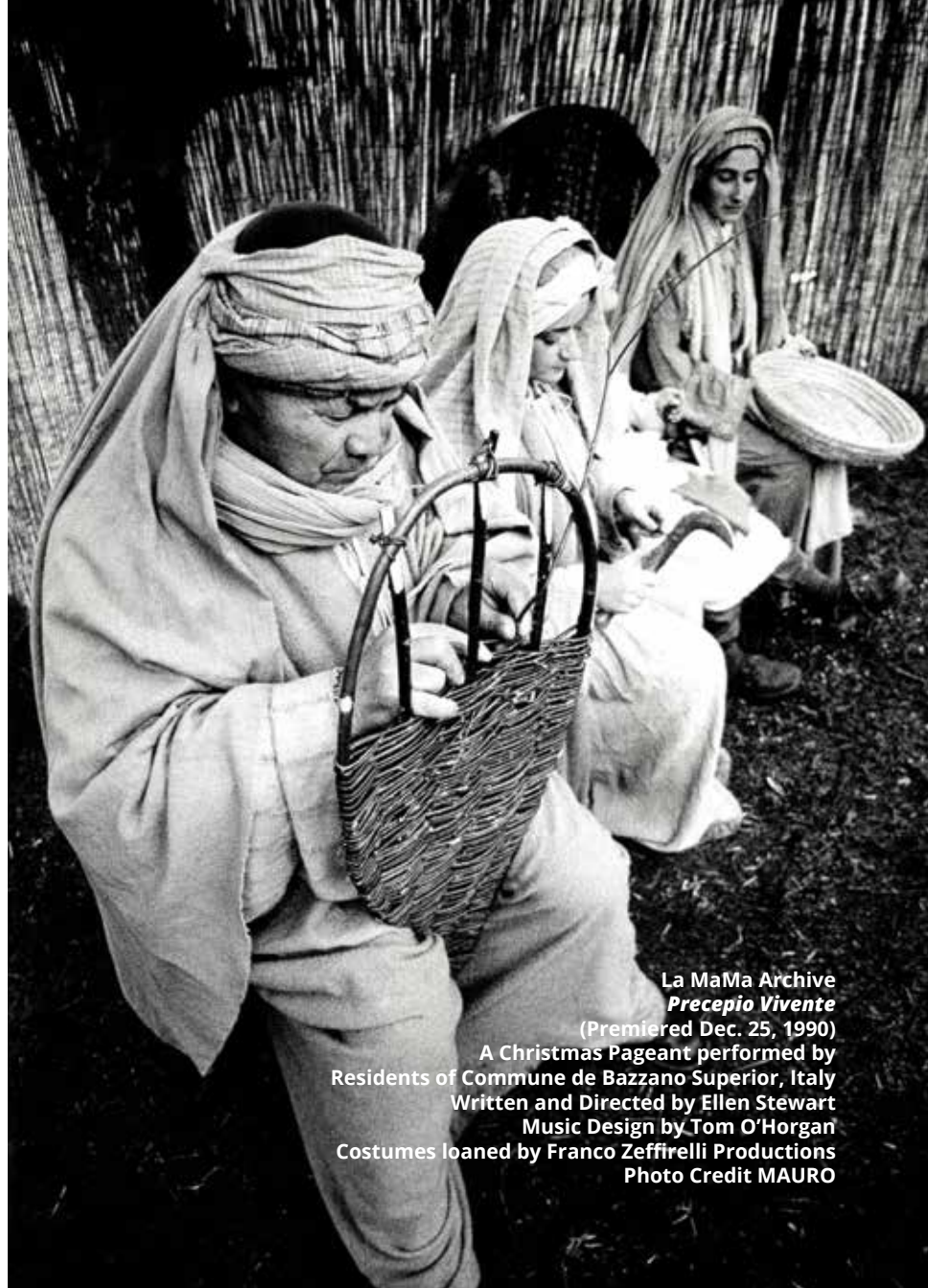

THE LA MAMA INDIGENOUS INITIATIVE

The La MaMa Indigenous Initiative aims to provide a platform for Indigenous arts and culture, both nationally and worldwide. The Initiative curates original Indigenous programming, including workshops, markets, and theatrical productions, to elevate the voices and artistic works of Native communities.

LA MAMA UMBRIA INTERNATIONAL

Between June and August, students and teachers reside at La MaMa Umbria, a 700-year-old historic building that has been transformed into a work center and artists' residence. It is located in the Umbrian hillside just outside the town of Spoleto, less than two hours from Rome. Immersed in the creative, natural, and regenerative environment of Umbria, culturally diverse artists live together while working on productions or participating in workshops to develop their artistic skills.
