Seagull Fucker is a highly imaginative theatrical production that centers on an artist's struggle to survive censorship and the personal cost of resistance. Produced by En Garde Arts, written by Eli Rarey, and inspired by the life of Creator/Director Sasha Molochnikov, *Seagull F*cker* contemplates the realities of creating both art and a life far from one's home and acknowledges that the fight to preserve artistic intent is, in fact, a universal struggle. It is a poignant story of freedom and destruction and people trying to hold on to who they are.

A word from Aleksandr Molochnikov, director

Seagull F*cker (working title) is a project my team and I have passionately developed over the past two years. It's a personal story tied to my experiences following the onset of the war in Ukraine in 2022. Like many Russian artists, including theater directors, I had to leave Moscow, where I had spent a decade working as a director. The plays we staged, which continue to be performed in repertory theaters, are now labeled "Directed by director" in response to our anti-war stance.

As time goes on and the world evolves, the resilience of theater remains undeniable. Presenting this workshop at the Under the Radar Festival at La MaMa with En Garde Arts is a testament to the idea that theater is such a powerful miracle, it can survive through regimes and wars.

Now, as I'm lucky to direct in various countries, I recognize that censorship and restrictions on freedom of expression are not confined to Russia; they are a universal issue.

It's incredibly challenging to pursue what you love and believe in, yet I firmly believe that this struggle is our purpose, and that's the essence of our play.

A word from Eli Rarey, writer

Someone steps on stage and says, "We are in Russia." Suddenly we are no longer where we thought we were. Someone shivers; someone else throws bits of paper. Now there is snow. A cardboard box becomes a tower in Red Square. This is theater! But is any of it so different from the daily theater we do when we wake up and say, "We are in New York." When a white house becomes the White House. What are the stories we tell ourselves in order to play our parts to great applause? Who is the audience we please? I call on the spirit of Trickster (the word play implies a trick) so that this devil might fool ourselves once more into thinking that we could be free.

Many thanks to Sasha Molochnikov for inviting me into this ridiculous, awesome endeavor. I will not be a dead bird in a dead play.

A word from Anne Hamburger, Executive Artistic Director, En Garde Arts

En Garde Arts likes beginnings. New projects. New ideas. New stories to tell. But we also like to be there for artists who are beginning their careers here in New York City. Artists who may not be accepted by more mainstream institutions. We open our arms to these artists and Sasha is one of them.

I met Sasha as a newcomer to New York, forced to leave Russia due to his antiwar views. I heard his story, saw an early workshop and met his collaborator Eli Rarey, recognized their talent, and I was sold.

The workshop you are seeing is a step along our journey. and we can't wait to have you join us for the world premiere in May.

Aleksandr Molochnikov is a film and theater director. He launched his career at the Moscow Art Theater of Chekhov, then moved on to opera and ballet at the Bolshoi Theatre, and film. In 2021, he was awarded Russia's highest theatrical honor, the "Golden Mask" for best ballet, for his production of "The Seagull" at the Bolshoi Theatre. In 2020, he participated in the SIFF Film Festival with his autobiographical film TELL her was critically acclaimed and widely released. By the age of 30, he had directed seven shows on the best stages in Moscow, as well as two feature films and a TV series "Monastery", which was the number 1 show of the year on Russia's Netflix streaming platform. He publicly opposed the Russian invasion of Ukraine and now creates film and theater in New York.

An American citizen and Columbia University MFA candidate in Film, Molochnikov pursues his passion for the performing arts by making New York City his stage, set, and scene. He is currently working on two major theater productions: "Directed by Director" at La MaMa Theatre (Off-Broadway) and "Crime and Punishment" at the Gesher Theatre in Tel Aviv.

Eli Rarey is an independent filmmaker, performance artist, playwright and poet. His feature film The Famous Joe Project premiered at Outfest in 2012. His short films have appeared in festivals world-wide. The short documentary project Two Faiths One Prayer has been viewed over 300,000 times on YouTube. Rarey was a founding member of SCIENCE PROJECT performance collective and a contributor to EMERGENCY theater gazette. He holds a bachelor's degree from Columbia University in Theater Arts and an MFA degree from USC School of Cinematic Arts, where he later taught in the Interactive Media Division. In addition to his work as a writer and director, he has worked in visual effects on both independent and major studio films. Rarey splits his time between Detroit, New York City, and the rest of the world.

Sandro Gurdzhua is a multidisciplinary artist and arts administrator working in theatre and film. Although this project has allowed him to go back to the music aspect of his life and strengthen those skills, Sandro is mainly a stage and film actor. About En Garde Arts

Founded by Executive Artistic Director Anne Hamburger in 1985, En Garde Arts is the award-winning pioneer of New York City's site-specific theatre movement. En Garde has a rich, impactful history of using the city as our stage to create, produce and present bold theatrical experiences that reach across artistic, physical and social boundaries. It has a significant legacy of producing ground breaking productions by Anne Bogart, Chuck Mee, Tina Landau, Reza Abdoh, Jonathan Larson and Mac Wellman, among others It produces new work at the intersection of theatre and social change to spark conversations that explore new perspectives, and build an inclusive community. Two developmental programs: Uncommon Voices, and playdate serve dozens of artists each year with bespoke support for artistic teams developing new work. When theatres were closed due to Covid-19, EGA produced A Dozen Dreams. It was a multimedia immersive installation that brought to life the dreams of 12 playwrights, including Lucy Thurber, Ren Dara-Santigo, Liza Jesse Peterson and Emily Mann, among others. Fandango for Butterflies (and Coyotes), a musictheatre production produced in 2020 and created by an all Latinx team: Andrea Thome (playwright), Sinuhé Padilla (music), José Zayas (director). It premiered at La MaMa, toured to Penn State, UMD, and was presented by the La Jolla Playhouse. In 2021 EGA launched a partnership with the Downtown Alliance BID, for the creation of Downtown Live, a festival of 36 outdoor performances, followed by Downtown Stories, composed of three theatrical pieces that rediscovered Lower Manhattan and its rich and complicated history. In 2023, EGA produced Helen, at La MaMa, a new adaptation by Caitlin George of the SuperGeographics. Most recently, En Garde produced- in association with Vineyard Theatre- the critically acclaimed, sold-out, production of The Wind and the Rain: A story of Sunny's Bar written by Sarah Gancher and directed by Jared Mezzocchi. En Garde Arts is the recipient of six Obies, an Outer Critics' Circle award and a Drama Desk award, www.engardearts.org

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
