For those of you familiar with my work, you already know how subtle, cringeworthy comedy, set in the backwater swamp of our celebrity media culture, is my favorite territory to examine issues I care about. *Swallows* is just that. This play is the result of a video sent to me in early 2014 by friend and collaborator Becca Blackwell. What started as a spark of shared inspiration over randomly googled YouTube fodder has now taken a life of its own for both of us together and separately in our individual artistic practices. Having sat in this research for close to a decade—maybe a lifetime if you count my interest in child stardom and teen idol culture—I'm now ready and very excited to tell this fictional, but inspired-by-real-life-events tale of consequences, redemption, and nostalgic reckoning.

JILL PANGALLO (Playwright) is an interdisciplinary performer working across theater, film, digital media and writing. In addition to her artistic work, Pangallo is an experienced producer, curator, and mentor to emerging artists.

ROSIE GLEN-LAMBERT (Director) [she/her] is a bicoastal theatre director originally from Los Angeles and currently based in Brooklyn. She is the Artistic Director and Founder of The Attic Collective, an award-winning Los Angeles based theatre company, as well as an Associate Producer and former Literary Manager of Inkwell Theatre. Rosie was recently the associate director of *Babbitt*, written by Joe DiPietro, directed by Christopher Ashley, and starring Matthew Broderick (La Jolla Playhouse, Shakespeare Theatre Company). Recent directing work includes *The Robots*, a new Chamber Opera (Project [BLANK]), नेहा & Neel (Wagner New Play Festival), a benefit performance of *Love Letters* (La Jolla Playhouse, Featuring Matthew Broderick and Ellie Kemper), and *Iphigenia in Splott* (The Attic Collective). Rosie received her MFA in directing from UC San Diego.

HEATHER LITTEER (Sloan) is an award-winning actress who's worked the Limelight Cages to the Lincoln Center stages! She is a vital member of the downtown performance and film scene having worked with Jane Campion, Mary Harron, and Darren Aronofsky in his Cult Classic *Requiem*. Litteer produces the 'On the Verge Femme Festival,' wrote and premiered her one-woman show *Lemonade* at La MaMa NYC, Edinburgh and London, and performs with Caden Manson's critically acclaimed Big Art Group, most recently at the '22 Venice Biennale. Litteer is a member of John Kelly's 4-person art rock band Rimbaud Hattie and the legendary arthouse performance nightclub, The Jackie Factory, where she earned the iconic moniker, Rabbit.

ANNI ROSSI (Iris) is a songwriter, performer and multi-instrumentalist from Minnesota, currently based in Queens, New York. Her career began with solo releases on notable labels such as 4AD and Too Pure, leading to national and international tours. In recent years, Rossi has expanded her artistic expression to include filmmaking and interdisciplinary performances, creating works where she embodies multiple characters, blending dark humor and absurdity accompanied by musical landscapes. Her full-length album, *House on the Seaside*, is set to be released this April on her own imprint, Land Majestic Records.

BECCA BLACKWELL (Brodie) is an NYC-based trans actor, performer, and writer. Existing between genders, and using the pronoun "they," Blackwell works collaboratively with playwrights and directors to expand our sense of personhood and the body through performance. Film/TV includes: Survival of the Thickest, Bros, Sort Of, High Maintenance, Ramy, Marriage Story, Shameless, Deadman's Barstool, and Jack in the Box. New York theatre credits include Is This a Room (Broadway and The Vineyard), Hurricane Diane (NYTW), and Seagull: Thinking of You (Half Straddle). They have toured their solo shows They, Themself and Schmerm and Schmermie's Choice across the US. Blackwell was a recipient of the Doris Duke Impact Artist Award, the Franklin Furnace award, and the Creative Capital Award.

JASON BERNARDO (Jake B) is known for bringing depth and authenticity to his roles across film, television, and theater. He recently portrayed Calvin Klein in Hulu's *Welcome to Chippendales*, alongside Emmy nominees Murray Bartlett and Kumail Nanjani. Other credits include the sheriff in the TV western *Elkhorn* and starring roles in independent films such as *A Long Road to Tao*, where he transformed himself to play a surfer dying of AIDS. Based on a true story, the film earned him multiple Best Actor awards and nominations, and he made his debut as a producer on the project. Jason also headlines *Murder and Cocktails*, a quirky mystery thriller available on Amazon. On stage, he starred in the comedy *Diagnosis Deferred*, a finalist at The Brisk Festival in Santa Monica. Originally from California with some formative years in rural Ohio, he recently relocated to New York City to further his career and continue to build a body of work that reflects his talent, versatility, and dedication to the craft. Outside of acting, he is an avid surfer, a Brazilian Jiu Jitsu brown belt, a wild horse activist, and an advocate for Transcendental Meditation.

PRIYANKA KEDIA (Lucky) [she/her] is an actress based in NYC and LA, represented by Innovative Artists. Recent credits include: Weird Sister in *Macbeth* (The Curtain), Juliet in *Romeo and Juliet* (Apocalyptic Artists), Maria in *Twelfth Night* (Theatre East), and Meera in the independent feature film *The Book of Jobs*. She graduated from NYU with a BFA in Theater. priyankakedia. com.

SOUJEE HAN (Devon) [they/them] is a NYC born-and-raised interdisciplinary artist and US Army veteran. They are an alum of MCC Theater's Youth Company and holds a BFA in Theatre & Performance from Emerson College ('20). Previous work includes *Love & Information* (Emerson College), *Sliver of Moonlight* (MCC Theater's Freshplay), a fully improved, D&D inspired show, *Given Circumstances* (dir. In 2009 life took a 360 and she pivoted and became a working professional makeup artist. For over 16 years she has worked on all sides of the biz—on the stage and screen in music, runway, sets, fashion, commercials, tv and film and also behind the camera with models, actors, comedians rockstars and celebrities. Expressing herself through the art of makeup is fulfilling and joyous. Theo is beyond thrilled to work with the *Swallows* team.

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
