*Protest Song* by Tim Price is a raw, urgent, and surprisingly funny one-man play set in the shadow of the Occupy London movement. Starring acclaimed stage and screen actor David Nellist (Sherlock, The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time), the story gives voice to Danny, a homeless man swept into a revolution he barely understands. Directed by Sarah Bedi, known for her bold, socially engaged work, the production invites audiences to see the world through eyes too often ignored. Presented by Beaver Dam Productions, a company committed to politically resonant and emotionally charged theatre, *Protest Song* is a timely exploration of dignity, activism, and the right to be heard.

**Tim Price (Writer)** Tim's play *Odyssey '84* opened at the Sherman Theatre in Cardiff in October last year. His play *NYE* ran at the Olivier Theatre of the National Theatre and the Millennium Centre in Wales, starring Michael Sheen and directed by Rufus Norris. Tim's stage adaptation of the film *Force Majeure* debuted at the Donmar Warehouse. Other plays include *The Internet Is Serious Business* (Royal Court Theatre), *Protest Song* (Royal National Theatre) and *The Radicalisation Of Bradley Manning* (National Theatre, Wales),

ISLA (Theatre Clwyd and Royal Court). Tim wrote the feature *How To Fake A War for F&ME*, directed by Rudolph Herzog and starring Lily Newmark, which premiered at Edinburgh International Film Festival 2019. He also wrote and directed short film *Through The Dunes*, starring Ian Hart, in his directorial debut. Tim has developed projects with Channel 4 and Blacklight for his television series *Farewell Rock*, along with several original television projects with BlackLight, Twelve Town, Kudos North and BBC Studios. His comedy drama pilot *Valley Cops* was in development with Objective Fiction. Previous television credits include episodes of the ITV2 series *SWITCH* (exploring the adventures of a group of witches), *Casualty*, *Eastenders*, *Holby City*, *Doctors*, and *River City*. Tim wrote a BBC Sounds podcast series *Acid Dream: The Great Lsd Plot*, narrated by Rhys Ifans.

**Sarah Bedi (Director)** is a director, writer and arts innovator whose work spans Shakespeare to new writing, wellbeing research and youth talent development. Formerly Director for Shakespeare's Globe's Ensemble and co-artistic director of BAZ Productions, they create bold, inclusive work for leading stages including the Globe, Young Vic and V&A. Bedi is also an associate at Tonic Theatre, championing equity and care across the creative sector.

**Adrienne Kapstein (Associate Director)** is a director, theater maker, and theater educator. Her original theatrical work has been presented at Lincoln Center, Soho Rep, New Victory LabWorks, PS 122, as well as in Canada, Scotland, Ireland, Romania, Croatia, and China.
